Frequently Asked Questions One-on-one Tuition

Question: Why is the Bronze Package (20-minute consultation) a separate package (not included in other packages)?

Answer:

* The 20-minute consultation is a critical step to complete before hourly lessons commence.

This session allows the tutor to discuss the results of the pre-service teacher's sample practice exam and thus determine the learning needs apparent and plan appropriate learning goals. After the 20-minute consultation and before hourly sessions commence, the tutor spends time carefully designing a personalised study plan and a series of lessons tailored specifically for the pre-service teacher.

- * The 20-minute consultation allows the pre-service teacher time with their prospective tutor and confirming tutor versus student suitability, before financially proceeding with and committing to hourly sessions.
- * To see if one-on-one tuition support is a suitable support option for the preservice teacher overall.
- * To confirm which one-on-one tuition support package is most suitable to purchase from the Silver, Gold and Platinum Packages. The tutor will advise. Please note that each package ranges from low, moderate and high-level support and our Gold and Platinum Packages include additional resources such as practice exams and online resources.
- * To see if there is an alternative support option more suitable to pursue, such as the Rose Gold Package (20-minute consultation, followed by a personalised study plan and resources), group tuition or study materials only.
- * The 20-minute consultation is at a cheaper hourly rate compared to the hourly rate of our Silver, Gold and Platinum Packages. We would rather that the student spends less money to begin with and be satisfied with our services before purchasing hourly sessions at a higher hourly rate.

Question: Should I have one-on-one or group tuition?

Answer: It's completely up to you.

Group tuition is a terrific option, if you would like to learn in a supportive, interactive group environment, with a specialist tutor, in an intensive, four-week course, with heaps of study materials provided and if you have limited time to prepare. Group tuition is cheaper, per hour, than one-on-one tuition.

One-on-one tuition provides hourly sessions with a specialist LANTITE tutor. Lessons are personalised and tailored to suit your learning needs and goals. An important 20-minute consultation must be attended prior to commencing hourly sessions.

One-on-one tuition is more expensive, per hour, than group tuition. Both group and one-on-one tuition programs are of high quality, comprehensive and are designed to help you achieve LANTITE Success.

Some of our students have opted to complete our group tuition course first, followed by a few one-on-one tuition sessions, so that they could continue to build upon topics and skills taught in the group tuition course, as one-on-one tuition sessions focus specifically on the student's unique learning needs and goals.

Question: What can I expect if I receive one-on-one tuition support?

Answer: Lessons are carefully designed, tailored to suit your personal learning needs and goals. Effective teaching strategies are used that target strengths and areas of weakness, equipping students with a 'toolkit' to tackle questions similar to and expected in the LANTITE Tests. Activities include the workshop of LANTITE-standard resources (created by us or recommended by us), comprehensively covering topics and skills required to pass LANTITE. Homework is set each week so that the student can practise the topics and skills learnt in their hourly sessions. Lessons are recorded upon request, which means that the student can watch the session that attended live.

Question: Will you and your tutors make sure I pass the exam if you coach and tutor me?

Answer: No, as we cannot sit the exam for you, but with our time, care, energy and expertise, we will do our best to help you do well, in the exam and to equip you with important Literacy and Numeracy skills for your teaching career and for life. We suggest at least a five weekly lessons before sitting your exam. Please allow your tutor to suggest you purchase and book in more lessons if you need it.

Question: I have been unsuccessful with the LANTITE Literacy Exam more than three times. I am concerned about whether or not I can continue on with my course or graduate. What should I do?
